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Speaker biographies

Harold D. Miller, MSPPM

Harold D. Miller is the Executive Director of the Center for Healthcare Quality and Payment Reform and the President and CEO of the Network for Regional Healthcare Improvement. He has been working at both the regional and national levels on initiatives to improve the quality of healthcare services and to change the fundamental structure of healthcare payment systems in order to support improved value. Miller also serves as Adjunct Professor of Public Policy and Management at Carnegie Mellon University's Heinz School of Public Policy and Management, where he was Associate Dean from 1987-1992.

Miller organized the Network for Regional Healthcare Improvement's national Summits on Healthcare Payment Reform in 2007 and 2008. His report *Creating Payment Systems to Accelerate Value-Driven Health Care: Issues and Options for Policy Reform* was published by the Commonwealth Fund in September, 2007, and his summary of the recommendations of the 2007 Summit was published by the Jewish Healthcare Foundation as *Incentives for Excellence: Rebuilding the Healthcare Payment System from the Ground Up*. His summary of the recommendations from the 2008 Payment Reform Summit, *From Volume to Value: Transforming Healthcare Payment and Delivery Systems to Improve Quality and Reduce Costs*, was published by NRHI and the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, and his overview of healthcare payment systems, "Better Ways to Pay for Health Care: A Primer on Healthcare Payment Reform" was published in January 2009 as part of the "NRHI Payment Reform Series" in conjunction with the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.

Miller also serves as the Strategic Initiatives Consultant for the Pittsburgh Regional Health Initiative (PRHI). His work with PRHI demonstrating the significant financial penalties that hospitals can face if they reduce hospital-acquired infections was featured in *Modern Healthcare* magazine in December, 2007. He designed and is currently leading a multi-year PRHI initiative to reduce preventable hospital admissions and readmissions through improved care for chronic disease patients.

In 2007 and early 2008, Miller served as the Facilitator for the Minnesota Health Care Transformation Task Force, which prepared the recommendations that led to passage of Minnesota's path-breaking healthcare reform legislation in May, 2008.

In previous positions, Miller served as Director of the Pennsylvania Governor's Office of Policy Development, the President of the Allegheny Conference on Community Development, and the Executive Director of the Pennsylvania Economy League of Southwestern Pennsylvania. Miller received his Master of Science in Public Policy and Management from Carnegie Mellon University.

Doug Anderson, Of Counsel

Anderson is Of Counsel to the firm of Bailey Cavalieri LLC, and is a member of the Corporate practice group. He practices in the areas of insurance law and compliance, health care law, and general business matters.

Anderson represents clients in regulatory, commercial and corporate matters. He joined Bailey Cavalieri after serving as Chief Policy Officer and a Policy Attorney for the Ohio Department of Insurance. Additionally, he led efforts in Ohio to implement state and federal health insurance laws, and served as Team Leader for Ohio's State Coverage Initiative, Ohio's Project Leader to implement a high risk pool, and Ohio's Project Leader to plan for a health insurance exchange in accordance with the Affordable Care Act. He also is an experienced litigator representing business clients in corporate and commercial disputes and insurance companies in tort and coverage disputes.

Anderson has experience with all lines of insurance and is a frequent speaker on insurance, business and health care related issues.

Dr. Yousuf J. Ahmad is the Divisional Senior Vice President and Chief Network Transformation Officer for the Central Division of Catholic Health Partners (CHP) where he has the responsibility to transform the delivery and implementation of primary and specialty care throughout the Central Division. Dr. Ahmad leads the division in preparation for healthcare reform initiatives including the development of the division as an Accountable Care Organization, the advancement of its Patient-Centered Medical Homes project, and Medicare Shared Savings Program.

Shortly thereafter, he assumed the roles of Divisional Senior Vice President for the Cincinnati and Springfield regions of CHP and President of Mercy Medical Associates.

Dr. Ahmad is a Fellow in the American College of Healthcare Executives (FACHE), an active member of the College of Healthcare Information Management Executives (CHIME), American College of Medical Practice Executives (ACMPE), and American Public Health Association (APHA). Dr. Ahmad is an adjunct professor in the Graduate Program of Health Services Administration at Xavier University. He holds a Doctorate in Public Health from the University of Kentucky, a Masters of Health Administration and a Masters of Business Administration from Xavier University.

Pam Carr is the executive director for Partners for Kids, the Nationwide Childrens Hospital Physician-Hospital Organization (PHO). Partners for Kids is jointly owned by the hospital and its 350 primary care physicians and 420 specialty physicians. The organization contracts on a full risk basis with the Medicaid Managed Care Plans in central and southeastern Ohio, covering 300,000 lives.

Jay C. Williamson, M.D., CPE

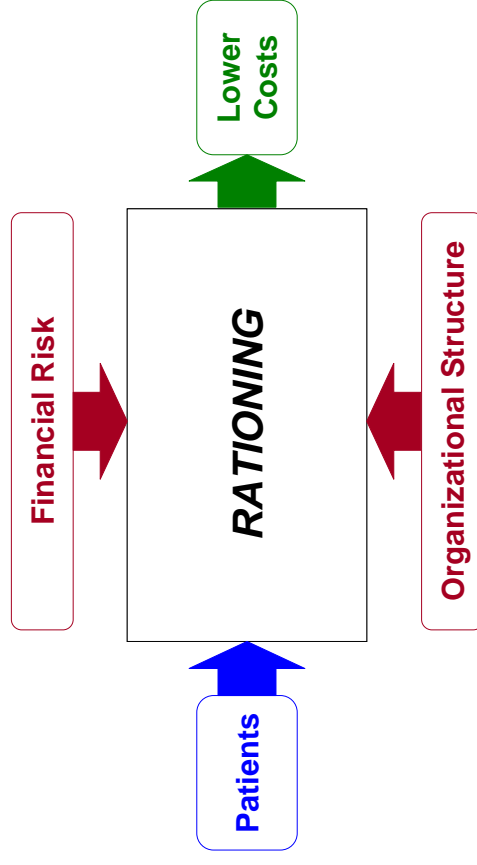
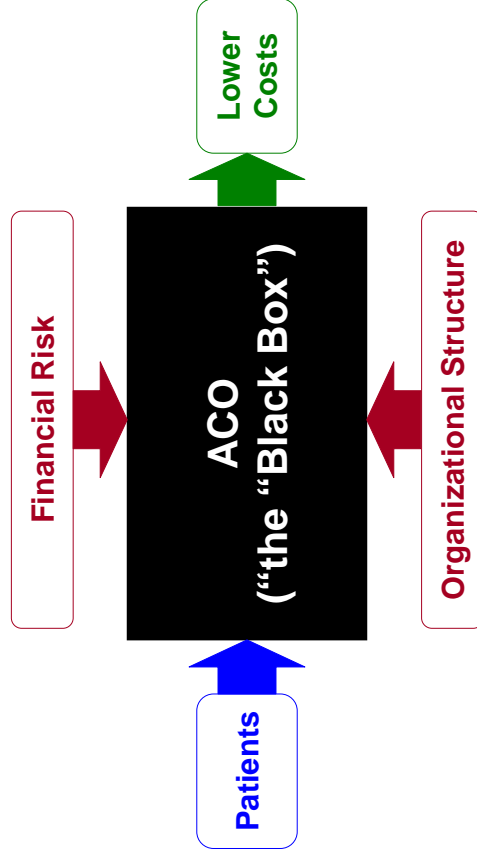

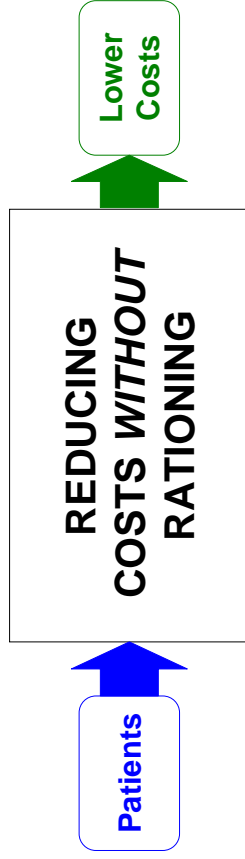

How Will ACOs Generate All These Savings?

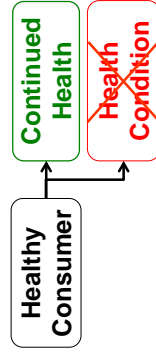
